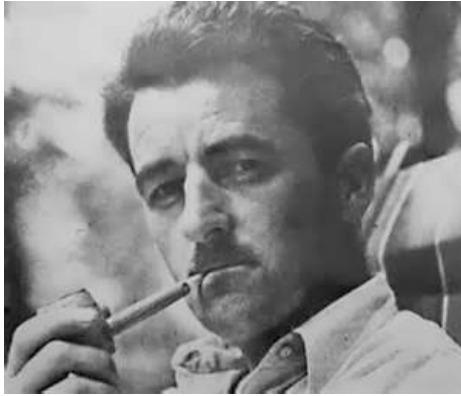


FAULKNER PRAISES TENNESSEE WILLIAMS

That's all I know of Williams. *Camino Real* was--it touched a very fine high moment of poetry, I think.”
